Get Out HER Vote Drives Are Growing

Get Out HER Vote 2006 is building momentum in Michigan. Campus Organizers Kassidy Johnson and Kate Nielson spent two weeks traveling the state to hire students to register their peers to vote. In Detroit they met with the Feminist Majority Leadership Alliance (FMLA) at Wayne State University and visited classrooms at the University of Detroit Mercy. They also spoke with faculty members and students at Wayne County Community College and Eastern Michigan University. Currently, feminist groups are registering students to vote at Kalamazoo College, Wayne State University, Wayne County Community College, Eastern Michigan and Oakland University campuses.

Additionally, the organizers met with students at the University of Michigan, Albion College and Grand Valley State University in an attempt to increase the number of FMLAs in the state. Kassidy and Kate will be returning to Michigan the first week of October to help with a final registration push before the October 10th deadline.

Afghan Women's Affairs Provincial Director Murdered

Safia Amajan, the provincial director of Afghanistan's Ministry of Women's Affairs in Kandahar, was assassinated by gunmen outside her home as she left for work. She was opening girls' schools and advocating for women's rights in Afghanistan. The murder of Safia Ama Jan has been claimed by the Taliban.

This is not an isolated case. Girls' schools and teachers are under daily attack. Schools are closing and parents are keeping their daughters home out of fear. In five districts of Kandahar, where Ama Jan was killed, all girls' schools are now closed and half the girls' schools in the four southern provinces (states) of Afghanistan are closed.

Farewell

Feminist leader Ann Richards died from esophageal cancer on Wednesday, September 13 at the age of 73. Richards was the first woman elected Governor of Texas in 1990. Dubbing her administration the "New Texas," she appointed more minorities and women than any previous Texas administration. After leaving office, Richards did not retire, she continued to fight for women's rights by working to increase the number of women running for public office. She will be missed.

Hispanic Heritage Month: Latina feministas

National Hispanic Heritage month is September 15-October 15. The month includes the independence days of several Spanish speaking countries. Celebrating the contributions and achievements of Hispanics across the world, Hispanic feminists are of no exception, but the rule.



A key organizer of the early labor movement and a social justice activist, Dolores Huerta co-

founded the United Farm Workers with Cesar Chávez in 1962. She later organized a successful non-violent boycott against the California table grape industry that lasted five years and resulted in the signing of a collective bargaining agreement with the United Farm Workers. Huerta, a national icon, founded the Delores Huerta Foundation which trains young



organizers, she also serves on the board of FMF.

Social justice activist, author and Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, Rigoberta Menchú is a self-educated activist who has proven to be a great leader. She was the subject of a book called *I, Rigoberta Menchú*, in 1982. Hugely popular, it brought attention to the human rights abuses and the political atrocities that occurred during the civil war in Guatemala. In 1992, Menchú was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for her activism in social justice and the rights of indigenous peoples. Remaining politically active, Menchú works with the UN on human rights issues and joined with four other Nobel Peace Prize women to call for a non-violent resolution to the stand off between the US and Iran.
